




Figure 6. Street transformation in Blacktown

b. SWOT analysis of Duddell Street

We are looking for more volunteers to join us.




[Countryside Conservation and Revitalization]






The resulting synthesis communicates how climate change, biodiversity loss and pollution can be tackled jointly within the framework of the Sustainable Development Goals. The report serves to translate the current state of scientific knowledge into crisp, clear and digestible facts-based messages that the world can relate to and follow up on. It first provides an Earth diagnosis of current and projected human-induced environmental change, by putting facts and interlinkages in perspective, including by using smart infographics. In building on this diagnosis, the report identifies the shifts needed to close gaps between current actions and those needed to achieve sustainable development. The analysis is anchored in current economic, social and ecological reality and framed by economics and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. By synthesizing the latest scientific findings from the global environmental assessments, the report communicates the current status of the world's urgent issues and opportunities to solve them.

David Attenborough receives the UN's most distinguished environment award



Nairobi, 21 April 2022 – The UN Environment Programme (UNEP) announced today that Sir David Attenborough is the recipient of the [Champions of the Earth Lifetime Achievement Award](#) for his dedication to research, documentation, and advocacy for the protection of nature and its restoration.

“Sir David Attenborough has devoted his life to documenting the love story between humans and nature, and broadcasting it to the world. If we stand a chance of averting climate and biodiversity breakdowns and cleaning up polluted ecosystems, it’s because millions of us fell in love with the planet that he showed us on television,” said Inger Andersen, UNEP Executive Director. “Sir David’s work will continue to inspire people of all ages to care for nature and to become the [restoration generation](#).”

Attenborough’s career as a broadcaster, natural historian, author, and environmental advocate spans over seven decades. He is most famous for his work with the BBC’s Natural History Unit,

香港社會服務聯會(社聯)與恒生銀行合作，於本年度設立「恒生技能創未來基金」(下稱「計劃」)，支援沒有接受任何政府恆常資助的本地慈善機構，開展與未來技能發展相關的社區項目。計劃以三大主題為基礎，包括「理財教育」、「氣候變化」及「數碼技能/數碼共融」，以及其相關的軟技能，希望能提升受惠者的個人技能，以應對社會需要及瞬息萬變的環境。

因應第五波疫情反覆，很多機構表示過往數月人手短缺，故需要更多時間構思服務方向及準備相關申請資料。為了回應機構需要，本計劃決定放寬申請期至 5月20日。

Hang Seng Future Skills Fund Extended Application Deadline to 20 May 2022!!

The Hong Kong Council of Social Service (HKCSS), in partnership with Hang Seng Bank, has set up the Hang Seng Future Skills Fund (the Fund) this year. The Fund supports non-subsided local charities to run community projects focusing on the future skills development in three main themes, i.e., Financial Literacy, Climate change and Digital Literacy / Inclusion, and other related soft skills in order to enhance beneficiaries' individual ability to respond to the rapid changing environment.

In response to the needs of charitable organisations due to the fifth wave of COVID-19 has a significant impact on manpower, **the Fund has decided to extend the application period to 20 May**, in order to allow more time for charities to prepare and develop service plan.

The Fund is now open for eligible charitable organisations to apply. The granted projects should be commenced from September 2022 for one year.

Eligibility:

- Agency member of HKCSS;
- Charitable organisations registered under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance (Cap 112); and
- Organisations that do not receive government's regular subvention (except the funding for project-based services and services awarded by the way of bidding).

Number of projects: 10 projects

Fund Size: HKD220,000 for each project

Duration of Each Project: 12 months (i.e. 1 Sep 2022 to 31 Aug 2023, includes preparation work)
